

COVID-19 and Enrollment Recovery

RLNC enrollment fell almost 50% during the COVID-19 pandemic. We must work to restore enrollment to pre-COVID levels, then grow from there.

RLNC Satellite Campus

RLNC wants to serve the 8,000+ Tribal Members living off of the Reservation in the Twin Cities. We are establishing a technology-enabled site in Minneapolis to do so.

Online-Only Degree Program

Migrating to online learning during the pandemic proved that RLNC is capable of delivering an online-only degree program. We are pursuing formal approval through HLC.

Student Housing

Our students need safe, affordable, and family-friendly housing that is technology- enabled and close to campus. The proposed facilities will cost an estimated \$12 million.
